I knew I was getting an outfit and basket from the Easter Bunny, and we would be going with family to picnic in the desert. Our picnic was in a desert arroyo (dry riverbed), not too far from our home, we were sounded by desert mountains and desert flora. When we got to our destination first things first, we had to set up. We put up tarps for shade, gather big rocks for the campfire and mesquite wood for our fire.

We at burgers and hotdogs over an open campfire and different salads and snacks. We had plenty of decorated eggs dozens of them. We all started in January eating lots of eggs for casacarones (eggshells we decorated and stuffed with confetti); we did have a few dozen boiled eggs as well. After eating my grandma would keep us by her with our backs turned so the adults could hide the eggs along the arroyo. When they were done, we all ran to find eggs, I didn't like boiled eggs so my goal was to get as may cascarones as possible those were the fun egg. We would crack them on each other heads with confetti going everywhere; we always had a good time. Now looking back at that time, I feel blessed to have had my family so close to be able to celebrate. That was the last time we went to the arroyo, since we were the 'youngest of the grandchildren on my dad's side. Easter was still fun years after since we got to hang out with 2nd cousins our age and went to the dry bed of the Rio Grande.

Relections...

Each year as we enter the Lenten season we are called to a time of repentance ~ a time to turn. Every year we examine how we have turned away from God. Sometimes, life's twisty roads can lead us farther and farther away from, not only the person we want to be but, the person God has created us to be. We can feel distant from God even while knowing in our minds that God is present; here and now. The mind knows God is here, but the heart feels distant and empty. We make choices which we know in our hearts are not what God desires, yet our minds rationalize our choices into the belief "I had no choice." Our choices can be driven by too many factors to even suggest or list.

Life gets complicated. Life is imperfect. We are imperfect. God, who created each one of us, You and Me and the Other, knows our imperfections. And always, still... God calls us beloved. In our belovedness we must look into the mirror and examine how we separate ourselves from God. In doing so, we begin to turn from our image that we see in the mirror to see the image of God within us. It is then that we see God's divine light and love.

Do you tell yourself: "this is just the way I am," or "I've been like this all my life, why change now," or "I've been this way all my life and I've done just fine." As followers of the Risen Christ, we are on a lifelong journey of being and becoming more Christ like.

Hopefully, this Lenten season, you have spent a little time these last 40 days looking for the divine nature of God within you or turned toward God seeking to find the beloved you.

The tough part of this journey is that each one of us must want to make the journey, otherwise we miss the infinite grace of God within us for the giving to others. The Psalmist cries out "Create in me a clean heart, O God, and renew a right spirit within me." (Ps 51:10). We begin Holy Week with Jesus' triumphal entry into Jerusalem and yet, we know it is the fateful entry into the last days of the life of Jesus, son of Man, on this earth.


These are the days some Christians wish to avoid. I have had folks tell me that they "come to church on Palm Sunday and Easter and skip over those Maundy Thursday and Good Friday services. It's too hard." They'll tell me it's too hard to look at: the intimacy of the last supper Jesus had with his beloved followers; the betrayal; and the horror of those last days in the life of Jesus at the hands of Roman rulers, the self-righteous religious leaders, and the fervor of the crowd. I now include the Liturgy of the Passion with the Liturgy of the Palms on the Sunday before Easter.

We are in the final days of preparation to receive the gift of God's forgiveness and salvation. God's gift. A gift that changes you, me and by the grace of God, one day, all of humanity. A gift that once received, is life itself ~ changing us, transforming us for the totality of our lives, earthly and eternally. A gift, that once received, moves us to share it and to give it away. Yet, we must receive it; to be it, to live it, to share it. We must pick up this gift of Light, forgiveness, mercy and love, not with our hands but with our hearts. We must choose ~ allow ourselves ~ to be that vulnerable.

God yearns for us, for you. *Will you* yearn for God? *Do you* yearn for God? *Do you* yearn for goodness and mercy to follow you all the days of your life? The Psalmist declares hopefully that it shall.

As followers of the Risen Christ, we remember the journey of Jesus and God's eternal love that we might choose light over darkness; to live in Light. For God so loved the world.

February 9, 2023

PRESENT: Lisa Morehead, Jeneen Kubala, Roger Mansfield, Audie Morehead, Cyndi Oblisk, Pastor Susan, Barb Rohn, Matt and Sabrina Finney, Lenny Reiter, Diane Ringer.

The Meeting was called to order by Lisa at 6:30 PM and opened with prayer by Roger.

Minutes read and approved as read.

NEW BUSINESS: The passing of Dan Kibler was discussed. Roger suggested that as per the family the church could make a donation in his memory. Cyndi motioned that a \$100 gift be made to 4H in memory of Daniel Kibler. Matt seconded the Motion. Motioned passed.

Service Time Voting: It was decided to have a Congregational Meeting on February 26 after Church Service to have congregation vote on Service times. Three options will be available: Service at 9:00 AM and Sunday School at 10:00 AM; 9:30 AM Service and 8:30 Sunday School; 10:00 AM Service and 9:00 AM Sunday School. Ballots will be passed out to members and members will be required to be present to vote. Cindy Jarrett and Kathy Galloway will be present to count ballots. It was also suggested that Announcements be moved to beginning of Service. Lisa will announce the Meeting February 12 to provide two week notice as per By Laws.

OLD BUSINESS: Matt and Sabrina shared that the installation of the flagpole as an Eagle Scout project will be delayed. Nevaeh Barringer is the Scout planning this undertaking.

May's events are our Service Sunday, May 21 and Memorial Day Community Breakfast prior to our Float in the Parade. June 11 is an Ice Cream Social, July is VBS, August will be for Fair Display, remaining months continue to be in progress. Dr. Seuss Birthday Breakfast will be March 4 from 10 to 12.
