Thank you to everyone who has shared their forthright, honesty, and thoughtful responses and feedback to the three questions: 1) WHO ARE WE TODAY? 2) WHO IS OUR NEIGHBOR? 3) WHAT IS GOD CALLING US TO BE AND DO? For the Search and Call Process to effectively move forward, everyone in the church needs to participate in the process which includes the Spiritual Assessment. The TransTeam still has folks to see and information to gather. This information will be provided to the Search & amp; Call Committee when they begin putting the profile together in the Fall. The information will also be compiled for the congregation. In the meantime, continue reflecting on the questions above and... What were the activities you did in the best of times at EUC? How did you spend time in fellowship with one another? What is simply the Best of EUC? The Search and Call Process During the month of August each member will have the opportunity to provide the names of folks you believe would be good representatives of EUC on the Search and Call Committee. ¹ These suggested names will be given to the Council along with the information from your Spiritual Assessments. NOTE: It cannot be overstated how important the Spiritual Assessment information will be to the Council as they selected a diverse cross section of church members for the committee.

With names and information in hand the Council, working with Living Water **ONE** Association General Minister, Nayiri Karjian, will select 5-7 folks for the Search & amp; Call Committee. This will be done late September, early October. First task: the Search & amp; Call Committee will begin their work of putting together the church's profile. Once there is a completed Profile THEN the search for your next settled pastor begins. While the Search Committee does their work the rest of us will be busy as well. This time of transitional is a time of exploring and a time of preparation for your next called pastor! Grace & amp; Peace, Pastor Susan, Gratitude The act of being grateful in our daily living is an activity that frequently gets lost in the stress of each day. Juggling errands, and tasks to be completed on our "to do" lists, and the difficulties that arise in our lives seem to overshadow gratitude. This is the reality of our lives today. Yet, we all have people, places, events, and moments we are grateful for, we just need to take a few moments to reflect on the events of the day. A colleague gave me the book: Sleeping with Bread: Holding What Gives You Life by Dennis, Sheila Fabricant, and Matthew Linn (2 brothers and their sister). In the book they write about the practice of the Daily Examen. The Examen is a practice done at the end of each day before going to bed. We are to ask ourselves two questions: 1) For what moment today am I most grateful?, and 2) For what moment today am I least grateful? (adding an "s" to "moment" wouldn't be a bad idea). Get a small notebook or use a journal to write down the

moment(s), giving thanks to God for all your gratitude's; the most and the least! Then say, "Amen," "Let it be so." Sounds like a blessed way to end the day and fall asleep; don't you agree? "We can only live in the present moment. We cannot live in the past or the future. Remember, the only time Jesus talks about the future is when he says, "don't worry about it." The past language Jesus uses is, "forget it," the past is forgiven.
