Happy November...In a few weeks we will be celebrating Thanksgiving. Did you know that the first Thanksgiving was held in November of 1621 after the Pilgrims first corn harvest proved successful. The celebratory feast included the Wampanoag Indians. Now, we know the Pilgrims did not know what they were getting into so who taught them to grow corn you ask. It was a Native American by the name of Squanto who was a member of the Pawtuxet tribe who had been kidnapped and sold into slavery. He escaped and made his way back to his homeland and he taught the Pilgrims to cultivate corn extract sap from maple trees, catch fish in the river and avoid poisonous plants. He also helped them forge an alliance with the Wampanoag tribe and they endured more than 50 years of harmony between themselves and Native Americans.

It wasn't until 1863, in the midst of the Civil War, that President Abraham Lincoln proclaimed a national Thanksgiving Day to be held each November.

Halloween's Ecclesiastical History

Traditionally, All Hallows Eve is a vigil for the observance of All Saints Day and All Souls Day, which fall respectively on the first two days of November. The name itself means "holy evening". The night is marked within the Church with prayers, hymns, fasting, and the reading of various scriptures in preparation for the celebration of the faith of the saints and martyrs the following day, November 1.

All Hallows Eve falls on the 31st of October,

which also happens to be the day for the Protestant celebration of the Reformation. Pope Gregory IV set the date for All Saints Day in the early ninth century.

All Hallows Eve and Autumn Celebrations

Despite the Church's success in establishing a Christian foundation for the autumn celebrations, many of the ancient customs and traditions associated with them were still practiced by the population. The carving of gourds and the wearing of costumes and masks to scare away malevolent spirits are typical of the superstitions carried over from these celebrations into the All Hallows Eve observance.


The custom of "trick-or-treating" has its origins in a ritual wherein the elders of a village or town would go from house to house and receive offerings of food and gifts for the souls of dead friends and relatives thought to visit on this night. This practice evolved during the Middle Ages, when beggars would travel from village to village and beg for "soul cakes". Villagers would offer prayers along with the cakes to those who had died in the past year for their transition to heaven.

In her Cooking for Christ, Florence Berger

tells of a legend of a zealous cook who vowed she would invent soul cakes to remind them of eternity at every bite. So, she cut a hole in the middle of a cake and dropped it in hot fat, and lo--a doughnut. The Circle suggests the neverending of eternity. Truth or legend, it serves a good purpose at Halloween.

The refrains sung at the door varied from "a soul cake, a soul cake, have mercy on all

Christian souls for a soul cake," to the later: "Soul, soul, an apple or two, If you haven't an apple, a pear will do, One for Peter, two for Paul, Three for the Man Who made us all."

September 14, 2023

PRESENT: Pastor Susan, Matt and Sabrina Finney, Lisa Morehead, Audra Morehead, Roger Mansfield, Cyndi Oblisk, Lenny Reiter, Diane Ringer, Barb Rohn.

The Meeting was called to Order at 6:30 by Lisa Morehead

Council members proceeded to the Sanctuary to hear Transition Team's presentation that will be shared wit the Congregation after Service on Sunday, September 17th. Council indicated that this was well presented and received by them.

The August Council Meeting Minutes were read and approved as read.

Upcoming Congregations Meeting Agenda: This was discussed. By=Laws of the Church need to be reviewed and updated. Pastor Susan and Reverend Nayiri Karjian will guide us with the process; ith will not be ready for this Congregational Meeting. Budget for 2024 was also discussed and consensus was to move this presentation to January Congregational Meeting also. Food Pantry: Ladies at St Joseph Church will take any food donations we collect at our Church. It was suggested that we alternate with Palmyra Church Pantry wit hour donations.

Bench: Roger shared that he has delivered the Bench that is in Memorial to Daniel, Bill and Donna Kibler's grandson to them.

Miscellaneous: It was announced that Alyanna Todd will be baptized October 8 or 21 during service. Worldwide Communion will be observed October 1 during Service. A smoke detector has been ordered for Kid Watch and Pastor Susan needs a fire extinguisher with Matt stated he would supply for her. Elaine Burkey has possibly agreed to play piano intermittently for Sunday Services.

Scouts: Matt shared that the Troop will have a Church lawn overnight campout October 6-7 with a tower and Spaghetti Dinner on November 4th.
