Pastor's Letter

Welcome to November!

Do you ever get the feeling that November almost as a whole just gets skipped?

October tends to bring cooler nights, beautiful days and preparations for fun Halloween. Before October ends it feels we are in the full swing of Christmas already. What happens to November- does it simply become a buffer to prepare for December and Christmas? Thanksgiving should be one of the greatest holidays we celebrate as a nation. Time to gather with friends/family and give thanks. I've frequently gone "Black Friday" shopping- but refuse to go out on Thanksgiving itself. I hope we are not rushing through the month. Here are two things I wish to highlight that will take place in November.

The first is a request for each of us to prayerfully consider joining in the efforts of "Giving Tuesday." This pseudo-holiday is touted as "a global generosity movement unleashing the power of people and organizations to transform their communities and the world." In 2020 alone approximately 34.8 million people gave an astonishing \$2.47 billion (yes, with a "b") to worldwide nonprofits. The Sunday before Thanksgiving bright orange envelopes will be available for you to take home to prayerfully hold and consider an extra mission offering. If you wish to give, simply return the envelope with your mission offering inside. This is not your regular offering, please don't take your regular amount and divide it in half. This is a request for extra giving. An opportunity to say "Thank You" to God for the blessings of 2021. The money given will all be earmarked for missions. (By the way, 5% of all your General Fund giving also is earmarked to Missions too!). With this money, we support local food pantries, refugee relief, the UCC special offerings, kid's programs, a new Literacy Pancake Breakfast starting in January-March, among other worthy causes and new efforts. An email will also go out on #GivingTuesday with a link to give online.

The second highlighted thing is that Advent begins November 28 (yes, I just complained we rush November!). This year our Advent Worship Series is "Cast of Characters" and we will look at some of the roles a few of the typically forgotten characters play in the Christmas story. Your story of redemption and love is intimately tied into their stories of generosity, faith and obedience.
